What is Taizé?

An ecumenical way to pray that's meant to foster reconciliation and peace among all people. The music has a theme of unity and peace.

What can I expect at an evening of Taizé?

A meditative candlelit gathering, that is simple, beautiful, and more about praying and listening with the whole self than with the mind only. It is inclusive of all who wish to participate. By singing together simple chants that are short, easy to learn, and repeated many times, those participating in the way of Taizé are invited to enter into prayer and attention to the sacred.

What does Taizé mean?

Taizé is an ecumenical community located near the small town of Taizé, France. Founded in 1940 by Brother Roger, who brought together people from all over the world, the Taizé community has long been committed to promoting and praying for reconciliation, peace, and unity.
